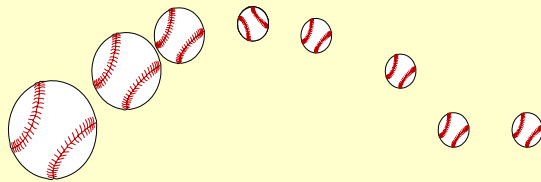




One Umpire Mechanics

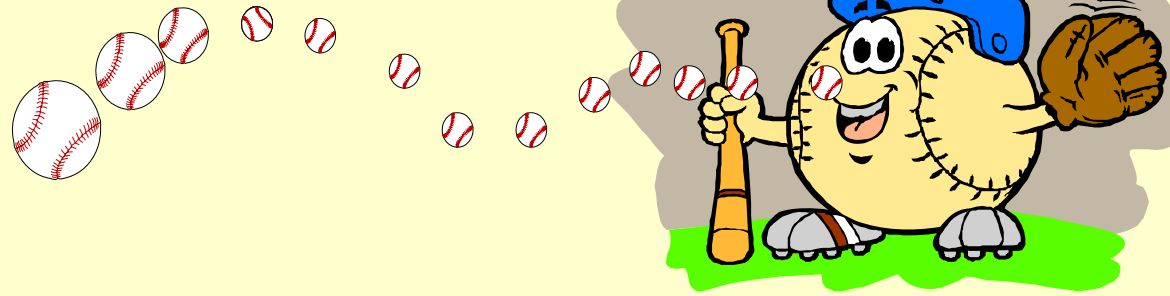


REMEMBER!

- You can't possibly cover everything that happens on the field.
- When it comes between watching someone touch a base and knowing where the ball is, **ALWAYS** keep your eyes on the ball.



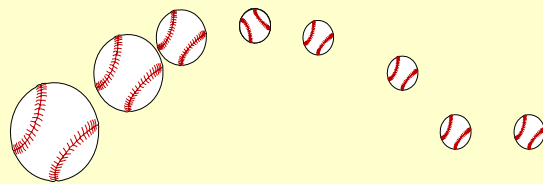
One Umpire Mechanics



- Tell coaches at the pre-game meeting you'll **WORK THE GAME AS HARD AS YOU CAN.**
- Whenever you brush off home plate, **ALWAYS CALL TIME.** Be sure nothing is happening while you brush off home plate.



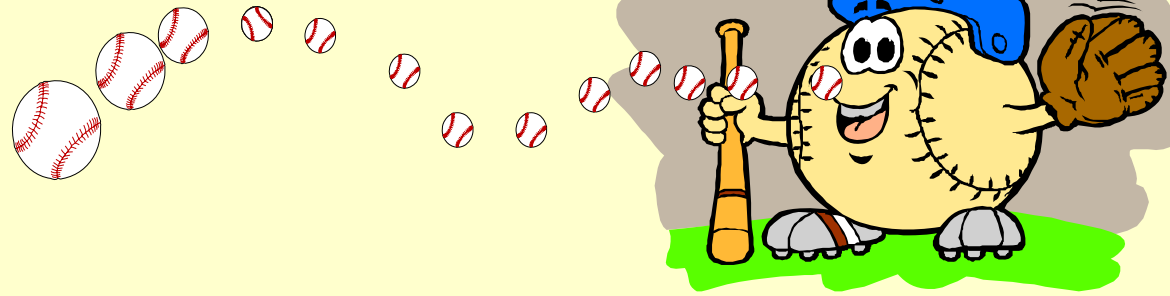
One Umpire Mechanics



- Anytime the ball is hit in fair territory, you **MUST** move out toward the center of the infield.
- If the ball is hit down the line, you **MUST** stay on the line to make a fair/foul call.
- After you making a fair call, you should move out toward the center of the infield.



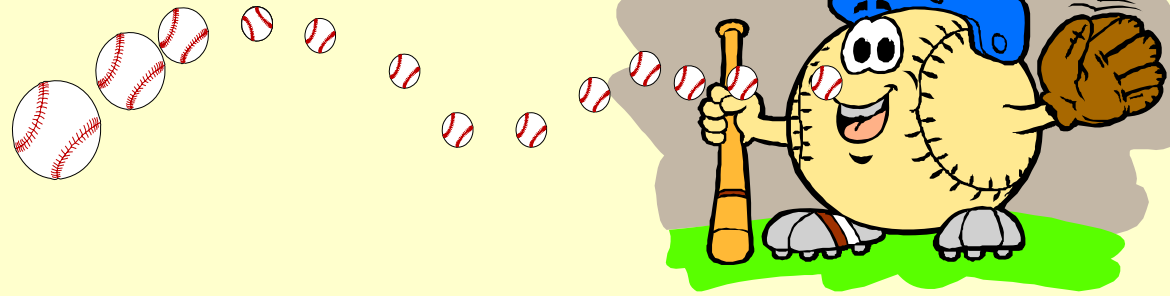
One Umpire Mechanics



- On **LONG DISTANCE** calls, the general guideline is, if the ball beats the runner and the tag is down, call the runner out.



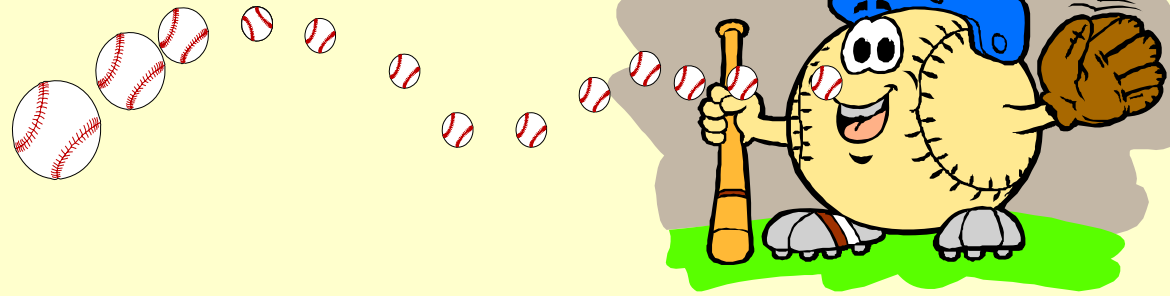
One Umpire Mechanics



- **ALWAYS** know where the ball is and who has it.



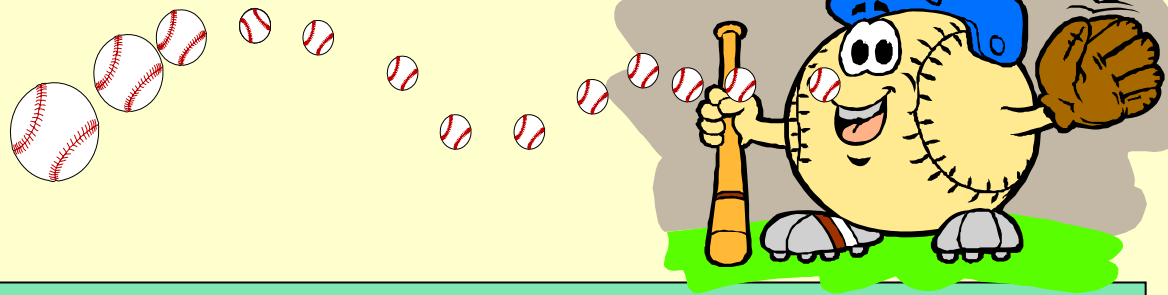
One Umpire Mechanics



- When a ball appears to be going out of play, **WAIT** before making your call.
- Be sure it's in a dead ball area.
- Once you kill the play, there is no going back.



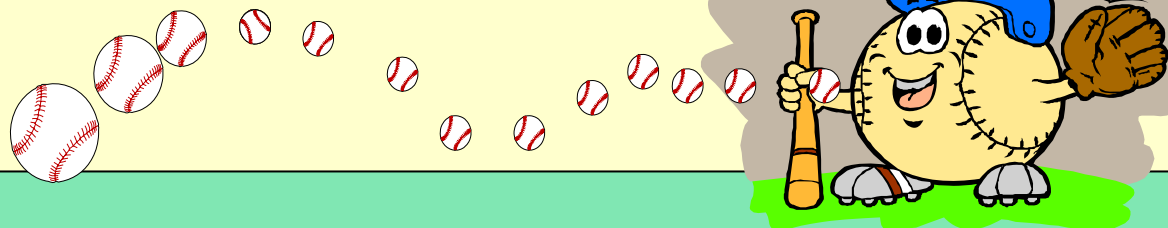
One Umpire Mechanics



- Steal plays
- Move only after the pitch is called and then move to the open area to get the best look you can.



One Umpire Mechanics



If you have a rules interpretation problem.

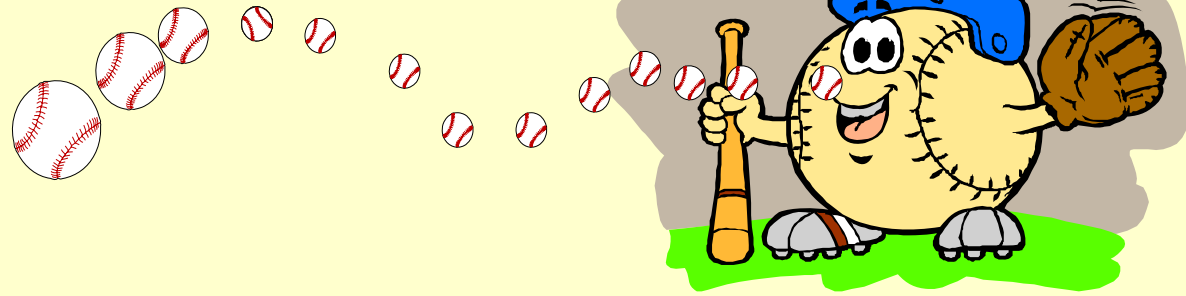
- **DON'T** be influenced by a coach who tells you how some other umpire handled the same play.

If a coach wants to protest.

1. Explain the situation to the other coach and see what he thinks about whatever the ruling is. If he knows the rule, it's to his advantage to have you get it right.
2. Do this **ONLY** after the other coach announces he is protesting the game.
3. In any event, if you are stumped, do whatever you think is fair, and then get the game moving.
4. Don't allow the game to get bogged down with long discussions.



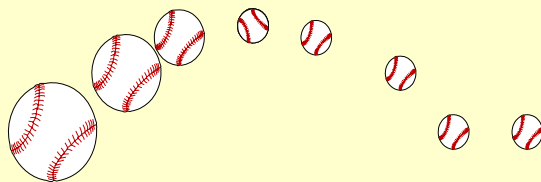
One Umpire Mechanics



- **DON'T** allow very much complaining from the coaches and players about positioning, etc.
- As long as you are **HUSTLING!!!**
- The best response is usually,
- “Coach, I’m working as **HARD** as I can for you”
- Then walk away.

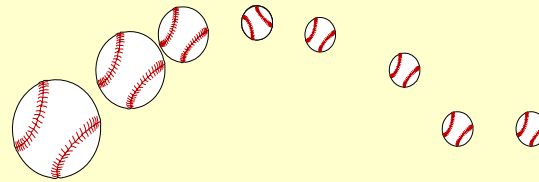
